1. BUDGET!

3. Better Rates

With those qualified leads some-

times comes preferred rates or special pricing. Vendors who work together often will sometimes provide preferred pricing to client referrals. This pricing can be passed on to you, but wouldn't be available without the industry connection.



4. VENDOR SELECTION
